The world-wide Sister City Program is a living legacy of the late President Dwight D. Eisenhower. He conceived the program and initiated it in 1956. The Sister City Program is a dedication of friendship and understanding between peoples of different cultures and attitudes. To those of us who are engaged in the program, it is a discovery; it is an adventure and a new dimension of self-awareness as well as awareness of others.

The special relationship between Santa Bárbara, California, USA and Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, México is also a tribute to local visionaries.

SB/PV Sister City was established locally in 1972 through the efforts of city officials and Interested citizens. Founding fathers were Richard Hidalgo (City Council), Barry Cappello (City Attorney), Frank Arguelles (City Council), Gregorio Ramallo (local businessman), Howard Goldman, and Antonio Molina.

**Extraordinary Work of SB/PV  
Committee**

The Santa Bárbara/Puerto Vallarta Sister City Committee, sometimes in cooperation with other city groups, has been engaged in a number of projects of cooperation.

- ◇ Bud Bottoms, the artist who designed the local dolphin fountain, also designed a similar fountain for Puerto Vallarta. Local architect and SB/PV Sister City member Gil Garcia designed the base and supervised the work for the Puerto Vallarta fountain.
- ◇ In conjunction with the Rotary Club of Santa Bárbara North, Gil Garcia supervised the design of the “Mike Lemus Rehabilitation Clinic” for the citizens of Puerto Vallarta. He organized a design contest of architectural students from Cal Poly University at San Luis Obispo, and supervised the development of the clinic. Rotary Club North contributed \$40,000 in much-needed equipment for the clinic. SB/PV committee continues on the yearly trips to provide equipment, supplies and funding for medical needs.
- ◇ With the cooperation of Santa Bárbara City College and its Marine Diving Technology Department, a decompression chamber and support equipment was secured and delivered to the citizens of Puerto Vallarta in the 1980’s. That decompression chamber is still operational today.
- ◇ With the cooperation of the Santa Bárbara County Sheriff’s office, beginning in 2002, three local deputy sheriffs perform annual excursions to Puerto Vallarta, providing training for the Puerto Vallarta Police Enforcement agencies. Instructors from Puerto Vallarta also come to Santa Barbara to receive training here.
- ◇ More recently, in conjunction with Rotary Club North, Goleta Rotary Evening Club and the Jalisco Federation, a \$200,000 medical clinic was established in Boca de Tomatlán, south of Puerto Vallarta.
