
Young Artist and Authors Showcase 2019

A couple of weeks ago, Sister Cities International held a "Young Artist Showcase" at Pilgrim Terrace Senior Housing Recreation Room with the theme "Global Citizens -

Resilient Communities". The event attracted twenty entries from students, including three pieces submitted from the Philippines. Judges Kathy Koury, Maggie McClennahan and Yuliya Lennon scored the students' art work on creativity, theme, and presentation.

This year's top three artists, Isabella Macioce (first place), Aria Jimenez (second place) and Cora Vides (third place) were all students from Santa Barbara High School. Macioce not only won top honors and \$250 in prize money, but she will go on to the Sister Cities International event in Washington, D. C. to compete for an additional \$1,000 and to be included in the top 10 pieces that will tour the country.

Sister Cities International (SCI) was created by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in 1952 to "Promote peace through mutual respect, understanding, and cooperation." The
