#### Boca de Tomatlán Medical Center Receives Permanent Funding for Medical Personal

Municipalities of Puerto Vallarta and Cabo Corrientes signed an agreement to share equally in the cost of placing medical personal in Boca De Tomatlan Medical Center which was constructed as a regional health center by Santa Barbara Puerto Vallarta Sister City Migrant Club through the matching Mexico department of social services 3x1 funding program for migrants.

Our own Berryman, Guy De Mangeon, donated one year"s salary for a doctor while arrangements for permanent medical personal was funded by PV and Cabo municipal governments

## Personal Note From P.V. Councilmember, Laurel Carrillo

As always, I started the week on the right foot! 👣 🔾 The agreement between the current municipalities of Cabo and Puerto Vallarta that I promoted through a building initiative presented on July 31, was finally signed on Monday.

With this, both governments are committed to paying the doctor's fees that provide quality services at the "United Communities Health Clinic", in Boca de Tomatlán. Responsibility that until recently The Berryman Guy De Mangeon a member of Puerto Vallarta-Santa Barbara sister cities assumed.

This is only part of the process that is intended to conclude with the taking of responsibility of said clinic by the #Salud Jalisco Secretariat.

Meanwhile, the clinic doctor achieved with the # 3X1 Migrant program will receive biweekly payments of 10,000 pesos; The municipality of #PuertoVallarta will pay the first fortnight and #CaboCorrientes the second, this for at least 6 months or a year, pending the diagnosis of rigor.
