Please note SB/ PV Sister City has picked up the Scholarship for one Santa Cruz Rotary Club past donor. This one scholarship is for a university student that lives in Boca De Tomatlán and he will provide volunteer service to promote the Boca Med Center that SB/PV Sister City had a hand in its funding construction. SB/PV Sister City and Rotary Club Vallarta Sur appreciate the continues yearly scholarship donations especially during these difficult pandemic times for both donors and students.

Update Of Boca de Tomatlán Med Center Activites

The doctor which City Council member, Laurel Carrillo had arranged for Boca Med Center did not work out. She is trying to get another doctor and will let us know if and when.

The good news is that Cynthia Leigh who lives and owns a hotel business in Boca, has taken responsibility for organizing medical and dental services for the Boca Clinic.

Nurse Martha currently works for free 6 days a week from 10 to 2. The fund being donated by the Berryman for Martha's salary has not yet made its way to Puerta Vallarta. As soon as the new Board is inducted, a bank account for the clinic has to be opened and the Barryman's money will be deposited there, In addition to her nurse duties Martha is helping Cynthia and International Friendship Club (IFC) to facilitate the opening of the dental office with a Student Dentist from Guadalajara University. Martha has a Facebook post and is already booking some dental appointments for this Saturday and will be there to receive the clients.

Cynthia is going to Vallarta today, to see if it is possible to get all the dental supplies in one purchase that dentist Victor needs to open the dental office, and he will help to facilitate this.

In the past, a donation of 150 pesos per adult and 70 pesos per child was requested. I think this is very fair and suggest they continue so that incurring expenses for supplies, cleaning, staff and utilities can be paid.

Former clinic doctor, Dr. Luis, is going to return a \$70,000 pesos piece of equipment that he is keeping in his house for safe keeping while clinic was closed.

Work is underway to convene a meeting of the Boca Med Center non-profit (AC) so that some necessary changes to the board of directors can be made and have a clearer direction to move forward. This is the condition of SB/PV Sister City so it can have confidence in good management and local fundraising efforts.

Thanks to Cynthia for taking on responsibility of coordinating Med center services and to IFC for arranging for a dentist and funding his needs. Also, thanks to Cinthia for making sure the interior of Med center is clean before Saturday.

These donations will keep the doors of the Clinic open and provide nurse services to the community, while we wait for a doctor to be assigned to the medical center by

wait for a doctor to be assigned to the medical center by both Municipal governments of Cabo Corrientes and Puerto Vallarta.

It's very gratifying to see how after a presentation at one of the Sister City Zoom meetings presented by expats Boca residents Cinthia Leigh and Nick DeLorenzo became motivated to help Rigo Montero take steps to reorganize the Boca Medical Center non-profit. The reorganized non-profit will receive your and the "Berryman" Guy De Mangeon funds to pay Martha, one of the conditions of continuing SB/PV Sister City support.

In the meantime the International Friendship Club (IFC) had arranged for a graduate dental student to provide dental service to the community and this motivated Martha to work at the clinic for free until the non-profit gets organized. But this organization is going to take some time and this will delay Martha getting paid but fortunately Art Fumerton has generously stepped up to receive the funds to pay Martha in his well-organized non-profit. This will allow us to start paying Martha beginning next month as soon as she finishes the list of services she will provide including helping with dental clinic services to the community. It's simply amazing how things are now coming together. By working together in collaboration with motivated people we can achieve all the desirable services at the Boca Medical Center. By the grace of the most high we are moving forward.


