While we are all staying safe and healthy we continue to work with our partner INTERNATIONAL FIREFIGHTERS TRAINING ASSOCIATION (IFTA). Here is an update on our projects

The success of IFTA over the last 60-90 days has been amazing. Along with that comes the work load, complexity of issues and logistics that have dramatically increased. Below is

list of projects and logistics that need to take place: **Fire Engine** <u>Donation</u> **To Comala:** Transport from Reno Nevada to Rio Colorado Mexico Border Crossing where Comala fire department personal will drive to Comala, Colima, Mexico.

2. P/V Ambulance Donation

 Transport from Albuquerque, New Mexico to Rio Colorado Mexico Border Crossing where Puerto Vallarta fire department personal will drive to Puerto Vallarta, Jalisco, Mexico.

3. Working to develop a plan and Standard Operating Procedures for the Comala, Colima warehouse/storage donation distribution center. International Fire training Association (IFTA) is receiving more and more donated equipment and receiving many requests (and we only see it increasing)

4. IDEAS TO FULFILL DONATION EQUIPMENT REQUESTS

 We're working to create/develop a written donation process/procedure. Obviously, we will never be able to fulfil all the needs, so we need a written procedure and be able to justify and be accountable for all donations.

5. IDEAS FOR DONATION PROCEDURE

- Requests must be in writing and official with city or community signatures. (Like the letters we have been receiving, I can forward some if you would like to see an example).
- If we have a donor who requests some items be directed to a certain city or community, we will make it a priority and honor the request.
- Maybe donate to departments in need at the end of our training symposiums? As the main idea is to trainthe firefighters with the equipment we donate. We do not want to donate any safety gear or equipment without the training. (Even just turnouts to departments that have never had any, shouldn't they have proper training? Even if it's basic and at least crawled into a live fire conditions like we have in the past).

6. TRAINING

SB/PV Sister City and IFTA is working to divide training topics and have a "Lead Instructor" to make it easier when we get requests for a class. That instructor becomes responsible for the <u>complete class</u>, develop lesson plans and time frame, prepare needed resources for all classroom, field/practical, handouts, everything, We have been contacted by many other cities in Mexico, including cities in Baja, to host training symposiums. Bottom line is we need more help (volunteers)

as we expand. I am open to any and all suggestions and ideas. Right now, everything is dynamic, so I will do my best to keep you all updated.

As we are a non-profit foundation, and as we expand, we must stay organized, transparent and professional. Thanks everyone for all the hard work, long hours and dedication to this rewarding project.

Rotarian and Sister City member Yvonne Pedersen is the founder of a new fundraiser titled Operation Bust Out, created to help the Puerto Vallarta foodbank drive while helping local children stay active during the pandemic.

Pedersen, a Goleta native and nationally renowned "Golden Girl" baton instructor, is donating her time to teach baton twirling and dance classes for Goleta-area children ages 5 to 12.

"It is a fun and safe way for local children to 'bust out' of confinement and 'bust out' some cool dance moves," she said. "Baton twirling is a great way to improve ambidexterity, rhythm, coordination and self-esteem."

There is no fee for the four-week sessions, but a tax-deductible donation of \$50 to the Santa Barbara-Puerto Vallarta Sister City Committee is welcome to support the foodbank project.

Classes are one hour and held at an outdoor space in the El Encanto Heights neighborhood in Goleta. Other locations throughout the community will be set up. Santa Barbara County social-distancing standards will be practiced. A parent or guardian must be present at all times during the lesson.

Batons are supplied for participants during class time and are cleaned between classes. Batons can be purchased for \$30 if students want to take one home.



PRESENTATION VIA ZOOM FROM PUERTO VALLARTA

Good afternoon:

My name is Stephany Fauvet, I am a physical and language therapist at the Rehabilitation Clinic, we are infinitely grateful for the opportunity to speak to you, to be able to share with you how we work at the Institution. The mission of the Clinic is "To give hope for a better quality of life to low-income children and adults with temporary or permanent disability problems" in Puerto Vallarta, Cabo Corrientes, Zona Serrana, and part of Nayarit.

An average of 1050 people are treated annually, providing more than 10,000 consultation services and physical and language rehabilitation therapies, with a professional treatment and especially with warmth to patients who come to the Institution with problems such as: Cerebral Palsy, hemiplegias, paraplegia, stroke, myelomeningocele, trauma from accidents, congenital malformations, facial paralysis, knee, neck, ankle, shoulder, back and any problem that affects the motor function of the body; in addition to providing orthopedic aids such as wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, orthopedic boots, etc.

All this has been possible thanks to the sum of the support, from companies and people who, like you, have a social commitment to help those who need it most. During all these years we have had the annual visit of the SB/PV Sister City Committee and their unconditional support for the benefit of patients.

During the last years, projects have been presented in which we expressed the needs of the Institution to continue with the service, these are some in which we have counted on your help: • During the last renovation of the clinic, the Sister Cities Committee helped us with a part of the

money to raise the floor of an area that was flooded during each rainy season.• "Rehabilitation scholarships" have been provided to patients with very limited resources so that they do not suspend their treatment.• Replaced the equipment for therapies, which has deteriorated over the years.• Donated gym equipment.• Donation of orthopedic assistants.

• Training by a physical therapist member of the Sta Barbara Sister City Committee.• Adaptation and equipment of the area for Language Therapy for adults and children.

• On the last visit, the project for the placement of solar panels and air conditioning was presented to the Committee for the electrotherapy area, children's area and language therapy. The Committee donated funds for the Solar panels. This project was considered for several reasons:

1. Air conditioning because each heat season is more difficult for patients, volunteers and workers to endure temperatures up to 100 ° F, due to the weather and electrotherapy devices. 2. Solar panels help lower expenses on electrical service, which is very high due to the activities of the clinic. And only with them we could think of having the opportunity to install the air conditioning. 3. And last but not least is for contributing positively with the conservation of our environment, which is compromised with the passage of time and human demands.

This project is not a luxury, it is a necessity, which we were able to carry out halfway due to the COVID 19 pandemic, since all the events we had scheduled to raise funds were canceled, and we no longer had the opportunity to acquire the air equipment conditioned; The Sister City Committee, always committed to their projects, has supported us with 1,000.00 dollars for these teams, but it is still not enough. We hope to raise another \$2,000.00 to complete the funds needed for the air conditioning.

I thank you again for the opportunity to tell you about the great project that is the Vallarta Santa Barbara Rehabilitation Clinic, of which you and Rotary Club are founders and active participants of its permanence and future, we hope to continue counting on your great support and blessing. Thank you.
