Association of Families with Children Cancer AFCC News:

An oxygenated water pool has been in use as one of the many treatments that has helped the little ones of the AFCC. A stationary pool has been installed at the Santa Barbara Rehabilitation Clinic that has been in use for some time and this water therapy has shown good results. Unfortunately, for some children it is too far for their families to bring them on a consistent basis.

Carl Lovegren, coordinator and founder, made the case to the board members of the need for an additional pool spa located closer to a cluster of the children. While the pool at the Rehab Clinic has seen less use by the children with cancer, it has been used by other patient there because water therapy is also good for people with many other type of injuries.

Your board of directors voted to approve the purchase of the pool/spa shown in illustration. The total cost is \$705.00 USD. Funds will come from money raised at the last "Cruise for the Cause" event with money set aside for equipment. The pool/spa will be purchased at the local Costco.

This is a great program because all children love playing in a pool and it is life saving as well!!

38th Annual I Madonnari Street Painting Festival at Old Mission Santa Barbara May 25 - 27, 2024: Memorial Day Weekend

The Festival is produced by the Children's Creative Project, the Festival benefits our arts education programs. Street painting is a performance art where the drawings will, over time, fade due to wind and rain. Its focus on the creative process rather than the product is at the heart of the Festival and the mission of the Children's Creative Project, a nonprofit arts education program of the Santa Barbara County Education Office.

History of the Festival

The I Madonnari Street Painting Festival is the first festival of its kind in the Western Hemisphere. It was created in 1987 by Kathy Koury, the former executive director of the Children's Creative

Project after a visit to Italy in 1986, to see the International Street Painting Competition in the small town of Grazie di Curtatone.

Street painting probably began in Italy during the 16th century and has a long tradition in cities in Western Europe. Artists began street painting by traveling to Catholic religious and folk festivals where they drew images of the Madonna using chalk on the street.

These artists became known as "Madonnari" or street painters. Their images are called street paintings because when well drawn they resemble paintings. These artists lived and still live from the viewers' coins thrown onto the street paintings in appreciation for the work.


We hope that the outcome of the workshop will be to follow up with more detailed information to interested

Belonging to a Sister Cities Group helps prevent Dementia?? Life style Pillar #6

Excerpts from a column of how to Prevent Dementia. Quoted from a Senior Congress, featuring speakers on a variety of topics geared for seniors.

This year the topic of "Challenging Dementia" was presented by Linda Ercoli, interim director of UCLA's Longevity Center at the Semel Institute for Neuroscience & Human Behavior. Her main message was that challenging dementia is not a spectator sport. The message is that we all have the power to be proactive in our own health and future. She reviewed the six pillars of lifestyle medicine and how they relate to our brain health.

- 1) Work on reducing your stress by identifying the main source and finding ways to get support. Some ideas of things you can do are to use relaxation techniques, schedule activities you enjoy or even just enjoy the outdoors.
- 2) Increase your physical exercise and incorporate movement into your daily routine. Take the farthest parking space to get more steps in, meet a friend to walk at the park, or consider a group exercise class to keep motivated and bring in the benefit of socialization.
- 3) Avoid risky substances and focus on fueling your body with good nutrition.
- 4) Try and reduce your intake of processed foods. Increase your whole grains and reduce your salt.
- 5) Pay attention to your sleep patterns and create a calming bedtime routine to set up your night for successful sleep. Considering journaling before bed and shutting all screens off at least an hour before your sleep.
- 6) Increasing your social connections, this provides, fulfillment, increases life satisfaction and reduces the risk of dementia. Prioritize the friendships that help you feel supported and seen. Reach out to create new connections and allow yourself to be genuine and honest in your relationships.
